

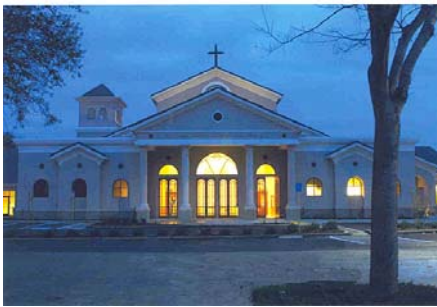

The New St. Joseph Catholic Church

The St. Joseph Church has been long awaited by its members. Before this, the liturgies were held in the multi-purpose room of the Notre Dame School and, later in the Parish Center constructed in 1996.

Consisting of a brand new Church building and a beautiful new home and

Rectory for the Pastor, the thought and design for this project began in spring of 2000 but actual construction began in August of 2003 and was completed in December of 2004.

The church is a steel and wood frame structure with stucco exterior. The building is 18,750 square feet and is 52 feet high. There is a 10 foot cross on the ridgeline and the tower that houses to bells is 65 feet high. This is a very impressive structure.

The church includes a Narthex, Nave, Daily Chapel, Reservation Chapel, Parish Offices and a Meeting Room.

The new home built for the pastor has a two-story Rectory located to the south end of the property.

We were very pleased to be a part of this construction. Congratulations to Tammi Sanchez, project manager, for doing a great job.
